GOALS & OBJECTIVES

By the end of the year, we want you to have learned the basics of how to make a great sound on your instrument, and have a blast being a part of a music ensemble. Here are our specific goals:

1. To develop musical skills in performance, theory, and appreciation
2. To promote a positive self-image in each student
3. To develop in each student a sense of responsibility and being a vital part of a team
4. To instill in each student the importance of their role and commitment to the goals and success of the organization
5. To build a standard of excellence in music, and in everyday life

CLASSROOM PROCEDURES

Making music is a lot of fun! However, as you know it also involves a lot of hard work. With your help, we can establish and maintain the right kinds of attitudes and the best possible musical habits. It is important that we as musicians understand and practice proper classroom procedures in order for each of us to receive the maximum benefit from the rehearsal. Classroom procedures include the following:

1. Come to class ready to participate, and participate.
2. Respect other people and their property.
3. Respect others' right to learn.
4. Follow directions the first time they are given.

Violation of classroom procedures will be handled according to the school-wide discipline program.

GRADES

Grades will consist of the following parts:

Quizzes/written work	10%
Participation	20%
Assessment (playing tests)	35%
Performance (concerts)	35%

****Concert performances are part of the music curriculum and student attendance is a graded expectation of the class.***

PARTICIPATION – Each student should come to class with all materials and actively participate throughout the rehearsal. Materials include: all band music, instrument (in good playing condition), a pencil, and any other accessories needed to play the instrument (reeds, valve oil, etc.). Points will be deducted from the participation grade for missing materials and non-participation.

ASSESSMENT (Playing tests) – Playing tests will be given periodically to assess each student's progress and to determine chair placement. These tests may or may not be announced in advance. This includes in-person and video assignments.

PERFORMANCES – Performing is a very important part of band class. Performances are listed in **bold dates** on the calendar below. All dates are tentative, and more information will be communicated as we get closer to the event. PRACTICE

Progress on a musical instrument depends a great deal on what is achieved during **daily** home practice sessions. The rewards of playing a musical instrument increase in direct proportion to the number of hours invested in individual practice. The key is to set aside a designated time every day for practice. Set up a daily schedule to ensure that practice is an important part of your daily studies. 30 minutes of practice 6 days a week is a good goal. Band students will have an instrument locker at school for storage during the school day, but instruments should go home each evening. The following tips are given to help students practice at home:

HOW TO PRACTICE:

1. Study it.
2. Count it out loud.

3. Name the notes (use your book for help)
4. Finger the notes (use your book for help)
5. Play it! Start each line slowly with a feeling of good rhythm. Tap your foot. Repeat the part of the line that is difficult. Write in the counting on difficult parts. Increase your speed only after you can play it perfectly.

BAND PARENTS: YOU CAN HELP!

Playing a band instrument involves an investment of both time and money. In order for your child to be successful it is important that you offer encouragement and support. Your child will catch on to some things very easily. There will be times when your child finds a technique or concept to be difficult to learn. Learning your instrument is a marathon, not a sprint. There will be moments that might be difficult, but working through it a huge part of developing problem-solving skills. Here are some suggestions on how to help your child achieve good practice habits:

1. HAVE A SET TIME TO PRACTICE EACH DAY. Help your child make a wise choice about when this time will be. It's better to do a little each day, than one long practice session.
2. PROVIDE AN ADEQUATE PLACE TO PRACTICE.
3. HELP MAKE PRACTICE TIME FREE OF INTERRUPTIONS.
4. ASK YOUR CHILD TO PLAY THE BAND MUSIC FOR YOU. If you are not able to monitor your child's practice, ask him/her to make a recording for you to listen to on your way to work! There's a good chance you will recognize some of our music this year.
5. HAVE PATIENCE IN REMINDING YOUR CHILD TO PRACTICE DAILY.
6. MAKE MUSIC A FAMILY ACTIVITY. Take your child to hear a concert. Use YouTube or other resources to check out great music.
7. ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILD – "Way to go! I'm so proud of you!!!"

PRIVATE LESSONS

Brownsburg's private lesson program is a district wide program that provides a high-quality enhancement to classroom instruction. Most of our teachers are professional musicians in the Indianapolis area and have advanced degrees in the performance of their instruments. Lessons are extremely valuable to the individual student. ALL students are highly encouraged to take individualized private instruction. Lessons will be given weekly during the band classes, before, and after school. Please contact the individual teacher to set up a lesson time.
